Welcome to Hutchins School for the 2010 Australian Junior Championships! For our many interstate and even some overseas visitors, a special welcome to Tasmania.

It's been a while ... the last (fully-fledged) Aus Junior to reach these shores was back in 1975, when Bobby Fischer was World Champion and computers couldn't even beat grandmasters. Three of the mere 42 players who played in that far-off tournament are now grandmasters themselves (two of them are here again for this event!), and none of the eight brave locals in the field could even reach 50%.

Things have changed since then. This is the biggest national chess title ever held in this state, at a time when junior chess in Tasmania and Australia generally is booming. Playing on the top boards of Tasmanian weekenders involves being surrounded by the current wave of juniors, many of whom will be in action here over the next two weeks. Meanwhile Australian juniors claim titles, defeat grandmasters and have even for the first time ever collected a world title!

It's a great time to run an event like this. We hope the players find their chess both exciting and challenging, and that everyone finds that playing here is not just a tournament, but a holiday as well.

**Events Tasmania:** Our sponsorship level depends on how many people we can prove stayed here! If you've come from outside Tas for this tournament – whether as a player, family member, coach, spectator, official or New Zealand Chess Federation spy, please register your presence with Russell within the first few days.

**GM Ian Rogers Simul:** Legendary Australian Grandmaster Ian Rogers will be giving a simul against lots of juniors, starting about two hours after the start of round 2. As players finish their games, they can join in - **once they have recorded their result and handed in their scoresheet.** The cost to play Ian is a remarkably cheap \$10/player (no need to book, pay cash as you start) with profits to the tournament.

<u>Lord Mayor's Afternoon Tea:</u> On Friday the 22<sup>nd</sup> from 3-4 pm the Lord Mayor of Hobart, Rob Valentine (recently seen playing 1...d5 and 2...Bf5) will host players, parents, officials and coaches for a free afternoon tea at the Town Hall – but Lightning players will have to move like lightning to get in there! Tickets will be available at reception, please RSVP by the 17<sup>th</sup> as numbers are limited. We will be assisting Lightning entrants with transport.

#### Looking for something?

**Toilets:** Down the stairwell.

<u>Food:</u> Snack canteen but no lunches for sale here (BBQ one day to be announced). We suggest having lunch well before afternoon games.

<u>Nearest Shops:</u> 24 hour convenience store on Sandy Bay Road right at bottom of Nelson Road. York Street Store (deli/mini-supermarket with some rolls, pies etc) on Regent Street (through Uni campus from Churchill Avenue and keep going). Some shops in Union building at the Uni may be open. Major supermarkets/banking/post office etc in Sandy Bay shopping centre – see maps for directions.

**<u>Buses:</u>** Routes 52 or 54 leave Franklin Square stop O roughly every 30 mins, direct to the venue. Routes 53 and 55 same in other direction. Lots of buses along Sandy Bay Road (also leaving from stop O). Buses are scarcer on weekends.
