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**Bulletin 10: The end, the end ...**



And then there were just two. Bobby Cheng and Andrew Brown will finish first and second in the Open Under 18, but we don't know in what order. In a dramatic game yesterday, James Morris outplayed Bobby Cheng and won a pawn in a declined Benko, but Bobby still managed to scramble a draw. Bobby leads by half a point; if there's a Bobby/Brown tie there will be a playoff and dodgy hiphop, but Bobby will win U18 or U16 regardless.

In three divisions the nudiustertian (sheesh, that must be their most ludicrous word to date) challenges have fallen by the wayside and the titles have been wrapped up with a day to spare. Andrew Pan secured the Under 12 title with a fairly easy win yesterday. Savi Narenthran has dominated the Girls Under 12, and Kashish Christian has won Girls Under 10. In eight divisions, the winner still remains unknown. James Morris, Eugene Schon and Yi Yuan are in the hunt to salvage the U16 title, but only if Bobby Cheng wins the U18. Only Abbie Kanagarajah or Leteisha Simmonds can win GU18, and these two will certainly win a title of some kind, as will Megan Setiabudi if she does not lose her final game today (and perhaps even then). As for the Under 8/Under 10 knot, it's so unclear that any attempt to even exhaustively list the possible outcomes would be simply embarrassing. May whoever who has been granted the cushiest leapfrog opportunity by the final round pairings win!

Just to fill up the page and use up my weird word quota, a little rant about pawn endgames. The indesinece of some otherwise fine struggles makes me think that for all the fantastic coaching they are getting, many players still don't think enough about some of the most crucial and fundamental decisions in the game: whether to allow or go into a pure pawn ending, and what to do once there. Especially with a one-minute increment, it is well worth using up a lot of time on getting it right, and not just swapping pieces blindly and playing fast because the pawns are even and you think the game's a draw.
