Can anybody stop this Andrew Pan? I can't; I played him in a blitz game once, and lost by illegal move, which was kinda nice really, because it saved me from losing on time. Today Andrew easily outclassed another well-credentialled in-form challenger and opened up a one-point lead. We don't want to put the mockers on anyone here, but so far, he has just seemed in a class of his own.

Abbie Kanagarajah played a very impressive game against top-rated Megan Setiabudi and now shares the lead on 3/3 with Leteisha Simmonds in the very open Under 18 Girls. I wouldn't pick a winner yet in the U12 Girls either, with three players still on 3, plus Grace Alvares who's on 2 and starred in the rapid tournament.

Anyone appearing on the top eight boards of the Open has got to be a more than decent player by this stage, and often these top tables are still nearly all going when the rest of the room is almost empty. Bobby Cheng has joined Andrew Brown in the lead, and half a point back are Papantonio, Yi Yuan, Fedja Zulfic and Alastair Dyer, whose wins have led to many terrible puns about opponents "dyering".

At the risk of obganiating (but no risk of boganiating) I do suggest to the lower-rated and unrated players especially that you analyse your position carefully before agreeing a draw or resigning. After all, you can afford to use your time, since if you do either of those things then you won't be needing the rest of it anymore! To this extent I have called in the dreaded **Draw Police** from the next bulletin onwards. Games in which draws are agreed while one player is clearly winning will appear with a little cop hat emblem and a very lighthearted "Draw Police – You're NICKED!" How many suspects will they apprehend tomorrow?

Pointless Metric of the Day: The game Wallmueller-Hughes reached an ending of KQ vs KR and a knights pawn that has moved. This incomprehensible ending featured in the longest game your editor has watched (well, parts thereof!), between Arlandi and Kengis at Mt Buller (143 moves, 7 hours 25 minutes). The Buller game was drawn, perhaps because Kengis ran out of cigarettes and the arbiters would not let him move on to smoking chess pieces.

The same basic ending was reached yesterday in Wallmueller-Hughes, but Peter and Harry quickly realised it wasn't going anywhere at their level and called it quits. In the final 18 half-moves of their game the position changed from "won" to "drawn" with perfect play or back again nine times. The longest forced "win" was in 81 moves and the shortest, 47. Even had Peter had a tablebase installed inside his brain, he would not have had time to win because of the 50-move rule!

Reading from the Book of FIBE by IA LewisRubenstein

A FIBE International Master title (FIBEIM) may be awarded by a lifetime of study and toil and moderate brilliance, a spiffy result in a particular tournament, or by having opened a cornflakes packet sometime around 1999. As FIBE is serious now about not giving away its titles lightly, it is now required that the cornflakes be of the Crunchy Nut variety and that two boxes of them be deposited on the DOP's desk. The DOP does not actually have a desk, so good luck with that bit. A norm for the FIBEIM title has something to do with the quality of opposition met but is mainly determined by the numbers of federations with which the tournament's small hopping placental mammals can draw a link, which must be of the most tenuous nature possible.

Once a player has qualified in a manner that could be determined by anyone in 20 minutes' scanning of the relevant data, the evidence must be repeatedly lost, misinterpreted, shuffled, printed in pink pen by certain entrants of the Australian Junior girls divisions, *in triplicate*, and buried in the peatmoss of southwest Tasmania until the heat death of the universe. Australian Junior Rapid Championships 2010

The day began with rumours that a coach was going to pull his entire entourage from the event so they could concentrate on resting up and preparation. Whatever the basis for this rumour, it was quite surreal to then receive a call from that coach asking those most basic questions every parent **needs** to know: would there be medals? Would there be medals for **all** divisions? Would there be medals for first, second *and for third?*

Then there was the entry list. A few “Schrodinger’s entrants” caused a lot of confusion and the odd unwarranted bye and we will have much better procedures for the Lightning to avert any repeat of this.

Then there was the format. The idea to award Girls titles from a separate Girls tournament (or two such, if sufficient entries) is not something those wacky Tasmanians invented on the spur of the moment, but something that had been discussed at the last Australian Junior. Alas we became confuzzled about the limited extent to which we had announced the intended changes, and it didn’t help that while in theory they’d been up on our website for months, in practice the wording was ambiguous.

So when we got the tournament underway the stronger girls wanted to play in the Open division as they were accustomed to, so being of an obliging mien we let them, and five girls “crossed the floor” from the intended Girls event to the Open. Except that as the first round unfolded the consequence of doing so became apparent: there was no easy way to award girls titles with the strongest entrants in one division and the remainder in another. Four affected players intended to withdraw, and there was no other solution but to scrap the format change and transfer all the girls to mixed divisions as in the past, carrying their first-round scores along with them. It was Cadburys and palm oil, it was a Beattie charm offensive (not sure I can say ”Bartlett backflip” in this publication!), it was almost the ultimate horror that was iSnack 2.0.

And then, after we had fixed that as fast as we possibly could, things settled down and there was ... chess! Stars of the day included James Morris, who blew the U18 away with a perfect 6 from 6, and Ari Dale, a hero to his online fanclub with outright first in the Under 12s defeating top seeds Smirnov (who won a U10 title playoff against Jamie-Lee Guo 2-0) and Pan in successive rounds! Grace Alvares scored an outstanding 4/6 to win the Girls U12 title and Emma Guo was an outright contender in the U18.
