Reading from the book of FIBE by IA Unharmd Lowson

Blitz chess is played between two playwers*, and the equipment consists of the clock, the players' memories of the FIBE Laws of Chess and a set of pieces which are provided for decoration and weaponry purposes only. The object of the game is to throw away as many of the pieces as possible, thus lulling the opponent into a true sense of security and winning or at least drawing on a some outrageous technicality.

Examples of winning blitz technique include claiming a win because your opponent has rooked a pawn then moved the inverted rook like a queen, claiming a draw because your opponent who is 13 queens ahead has pushed a pawn to the end, said "queen please" and pressed the clock, and adding insult to injury by claiming a win because your opponent has captured one of his/her own pieces.
